Mission in the United Church of Christ - Heifer Project International

In Peru, since 1999, nearly four thousand families have worked directly with Heifer Project and another one thousand have been passed an offspring gift. In Cochuma, forty-five families have received sheep and ninety families have pass-on animals. The village also received ten draft horses and special training in sustainable use of both highland and rainforest land.
